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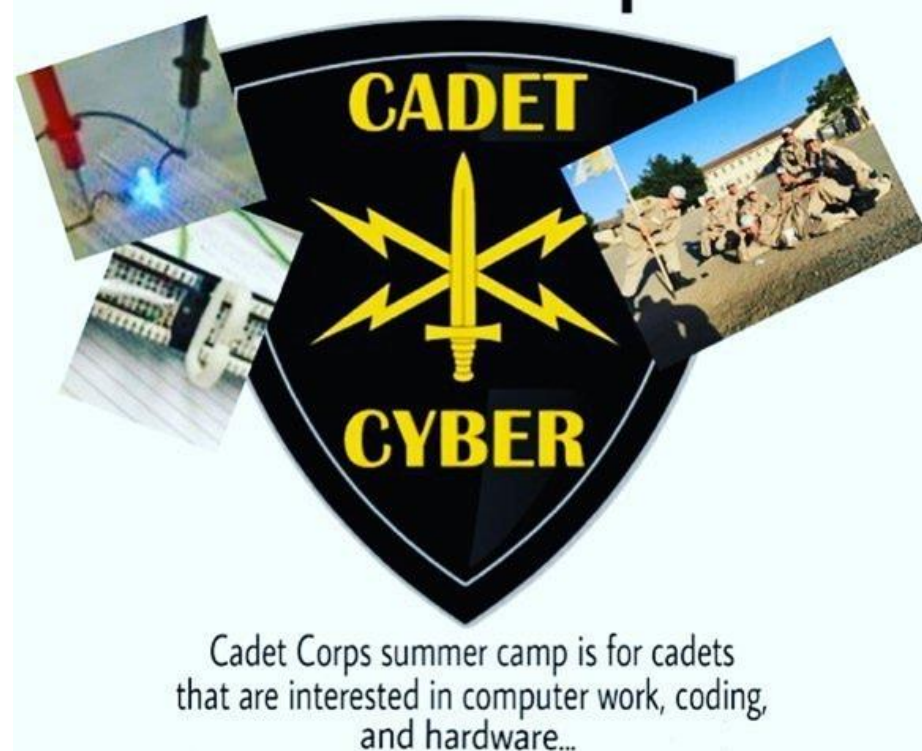

The State of California is dedicated to expanding the Cadet Corp JROTC program sevenfold, from 50 schools to 175 schools.

Schools adopting the Cadet Corps program can expect uniforms, curriculum, and other logistics to help solidify a robust campus presence.

Schools wanting to “test the waters” with a few course offerings, the Cadet Corps will train that instructor to be a commandant via commandant training programs in 7 day intervals over the summer.



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## A-G Certification

The University of California (UC) and the California State University (CSU) systems have established a uniform minimum set of courses required for admission as a freshman. The UC maintains public “a-g” course lists that provide complete information about the high school courses approved for admission to the university.

Individual California Cadet Corps classes **have been approved by the UC system as meeting the "g college-preparatory elective"** requirements at several schools. Until a program-wide approval is achieved, high schools with a Cadet Corps Program are encouraged to submit their program for "a-g" certification at the UC Site <https://hs-articulation.ucop.edu/agcmp/login#/>.
