## STUDENT RECORDS

The Governing Board recognizes the importance of keeping accurate, comprehensive student records as required by law. The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the district's administrative regulation and school site procedures for maintaining the confidentiality of student records are consistent with state and federal law.

The Superintendent or designee shall <u>maintain</u>, in <u>writing</u>, <u>policies</u> and <u>procedures for gathering and handling sensitive student information</u>, and shall ensure that appropriate personnel receive training <u>pursuant to these policies and procedures</u>. <u>establish administrative regulations governing the identification, description and security of student records</u>. These regulations shall ensure the rights of authorized persons to have timely access and shall protect the student and his/her their families from invasion of privacy.

If the District is in possession of information that is indicative of a student's immigration status, eitizenship status, or information regarding national origin, the District shall not use such information to discriminate against any student or their family members, nor shall the District use such information to prevent children from enrolling in or attending school. The District shall treat all students equitably in the receipt of all school services, including, but, not limited to, the gathering of student and family information for the free and reduced lunch program, transportation and educational instruction. If a parent or guardian does not provide the District with information that is indicative of their or their child's immigration status, citizenship status, or information regarding their national origin, the District shall not use such a fact as a basis for discriminating against any student or their family members, nor shall the District use such a fact to prevent children from enrolling in or attending school.

The District shall not allow school resources or data to be used to create a registry based on race, gender, sexual orientation, religion, ethnicity, immigration status, citizenship status, or national origin.

The District shall not solicit or collect entire Social Security numbers or cards. However, the District shall solicit and collect the last four digits of an adult household member's Social Security number only if required to establish eligibility for federal benefit programs; the District shall explain the limited purpose for which this information is being collected, and clarify that the failure to provide this information will not bar the student from enrolling in or attending school.

The Superintendent or designee shall designate a certificated employee to serve as custodian of records, with responsibility for student records at the district level. At each school, the principal or a certificated employee shall be designated as custodian of records for students enrolled at that school. The custodian of records shall be responsible for implementing Board policy and administrative regulation regarding student records.

# Contract for Digital Storage, Management, and Retrieval of Student Records

The Superintendent or designee may enter into a contract with a third party for the digital storage, management, and retrieval of student records and/or to authorize a third party provider of digital
